\$150,000 in Grants will be awarded through Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation

The company will provide \$60,000 to fund 12 grants in support of Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation's (ALSF) Pediatric Oncology Student Training (POST) Program. Northwestern Mutual is also funding \$90,000 for medical researchers to purchase essential lab and research equipment at 16 hospitals and universities nationwide.

It aims to expose students to the field of pediatric oncology research, help develop practical research skills, provide hands-on research experience and encourage continued research in the field post-graduation. POST students provide researchers critical assistance to help advance their research.

"More than 10,000 kids in the U.S. were diagnosed with cancer last year and the causes of most childhood cancers are unknown, so it's critical we do our part to find a cure," said Eric Christophersen, president of the Northwestern Mutual Foundation.
