

Northwestern Mutual Announces 26 Grants to Promote Literacy and Higher Education

Almost \$1.4 million in funding will strengthen local nonprofits and educational institutions

MILWAUKEE, April 3, 2012 [PRNewswire](#) -- Numerous studies show that a child's reading skill is a key determinant of future success both inside and outside the classroom. Northwestern Mutual, through its [Foundation](#), is announcing 26 grants totaling nearly \$1.4 million to 23 Wisconsin nonprofits that promote childhood literacy and increase access to higher education.

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Eighteen Northwestern Mutual grants strengthen kindergarten-to-12th grade reading programs that build academic aptitude and help increase high school graduation rates. The remaining eight grants support higher education programs, including scholarship awards for first generation college students.

"Few things shape the stability of a child's life and a community's future like education, and it all begins with being able to read," said John Kordsmeier, president, Northwestern Mutual Foundation. "By investing in effective literacy programs, more children will be able to reach their full potential and we'll build a stronger community."

Spotlight on Teach For America - Milwaukee

One recipient of a [Northwestern Mutual](#) grant is Teach For America – Milwaukee. The organization works in partnership with communities to expand educational opportunities for children facing the challenges of poverty. Teach For America recruits and develops recent college graduates and professionals to teach for two years in low-income communities throughout the United States. Northwestern Mutual's support has helped place 100 teachers jobs in high-needs schools in Milwaukee. These teachers have impacted the lives of approximately 6,000 students in grades K-12 and nearly 90 percent of students taught by second-year Teach For America teachers average more than one grade level of growth in their reading levels.

"The vast majority of the 16 million children living in poverty across the nation are not getting an excellent education," said Maurice Thomas, executive director, Teach for America – Milwaukee. "This generous gift will support the training and ongoing leadership development of teachers and alumni dedicated to working alongside community efforts to ensure that even more students in Milwaukee have the educational opportunities they deserve. We are very thankful for Northwestern Mutual's commitment to educational equity and excellence."
