Northwestern Mutual Foundation Announces 29 Grants to Boost Literacy and Access to Higher Education in Wisconsin

Marquette University is receiving two Foundation grants, including funds to financially assist four first-generation college students and support the construction of the new Eckstein Hall at the Marquette University Law School.

"A high-quality education cultivates future generations of community and business leaders, adding to the long-term stability of our city and state," said Julie Tolan, vice president for university advancement at Marquette University. "The support of the Northwestern Mutual Foundation – our longtime neighbor – will uplift first generation college scholars and Milwaukee's law school."

Teach For America's Milwaukee program is also another Foundation grant recipient. Comprised of outstanding recent college graduates that commit to two years to expand educational opportunities in urban areas, Teach For America currently has 88 corps volunteers serving in Milwaukee Public Schools.

"According to the 2010 U.S. Census, Milwaukee is the nation's fourth poorest city – contributing to the plight of Milwaukee Public Schools," said Garrett Bucks, executive director, Teach For America–Milwaukee. "The Northwestern Mutual Foundation's contribution allows us to cost-efficiently integrate young, highly motivated educators into MPS – opening the window of opportunity for inner-city students."
