Children with cancer receive \$2 million boost

There will be a community room that provides an environment of emotional support while care is delivered, and where patients and families may engage in play and educational activities led by specially trained staff. It also will include a pharmacy for dispensing medicines used to treat children with cancer and blood disorders. The Northwestern Mutual Day Hospital for Childhood Cancer is scheduled to open in early 2015.
